WCCA Meeting Minutes March 16, 2016

A Board of Director's Meeting was held prior to the meeting. The following items were discussed:

- Donations the following was approved for presentation to the members for subsequent vote/approval:
 - A \$1,000 donation to the Kettle Moraine Trap Club to support the high school trap team
 - A \$500 donation to the Ojibwa Bowhunters to support their Annual Youth Day
 - o A \$250 donation to District 11/12 Hospitality to help fund busses to MacKenzie
 - A \$250 donation to the WCSFO for the reprinting of the fishing books
 - o A \$50 donation to American Legion Aux. 91/Fischer House
- Al Bohachek Memorial the disbursement of his memorial funds will be presented to the Arrowhead High School Forestry Program. An invitation will be sent to the instructor to attend an Alliance meeting and receive the funds.

President Ron Gray called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm at the Wales/Genesee Lions Club. The meeting was sponsored by the Wales/Genesee Lions Club, who provided the refreshments. The meeting was attended by 22 individuals, comprised of club delegates and the Wisconsin Conservation Congress.

The Alliance owes a thank you to Randy Farchmin, Treasurer of the Alliance, for all of his work on the 2016 banquet.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

The minutes of the February 17th meeting were amended to correct: 1) the board recommendation date to "March" meeting, and 2) the migratory meeting to March 5, and a 9/1 start date to the teal season under the Conservation Congress committee reports by AI.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

The treasurer was not present at the meeting.

- **DNR Weekly News Update** A reminder that you can subscribe to this information via this link: https://service.govdelivery.com/service/multi-subscribe.html?code=WIDNR. The Go Wild program is estimated to start 3/21. There is a Learn To Hunt Bear program in the summer. More than 3,100 deer were tested this year for CWD; of those, 290 were positive were primarily in affected areas. The public comment period is open from April 4 17, and CDACs will meet during the week of April 18 to make their final recommendations.

Kids Fishing Clinics –

Conservation Congress –

- Al
 - Migratory meeting they used to get the May/August counts and now using previous year's counts to determine season/limits. The southern zone will start 10/1 with a 5 day split. The northern zone will start 9/24. The Mississippi zone will start 10/1 with a 7 day split. The bag limits stay the same. The Horicon zone is now one zone. The exterior zone is 5/day for early goose. There was no money for field monitoring/nest success. As a note: in Wisconsin, Michigan and Illinois, 70% of mallards shot are local. This has lent to an 11% decrease in hen population in the past 5 years. If the hen population continues to decrease, the 60 day season will disappear.
 - District meeting/Sturtevant All questions are online. All and Mark are up for reelection. The spring hearings are April 11 at 7 PM. Questions were made as to who is running in Milwaukee for a Conservation Congress seat.
 - CDAC meeting Set to maintain population numbers in Waukesha County. Proposed 2,000 antlerless permits of which 1500 are private and 500 are public. It's estimated there are 15,000 deer in Waukesha County. County voted yes to have an antlerless only holiday hunt from 12/24 1/1.
